



Public Transportation

MUNI

The San Francisco municipal railway, MUNI, is the largest public transit system in the Bay Area. With over 200 millions riders annually, MUNI's fleet includes: modern light-rail vehicles, alternative fuel vehicles, diesel buses, cable cars, and a collection of historic streetcars. BART

The Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) is the regional transit system that connects San Francisco to the East Bay through an underwater tunnel. BART also helps commuters get to Northern San Mateo County, and the San Francisco International Airport (as well as the Oakland International Airport with the aide of shuttle buses). BART fares vary depending on your starting point and your final destination, please log onto www.bart.gov for more details.

Caltrain

Caltrain provides rail service between San Francisco and San Jose, with additional weekday commute-hour service to Gilroy. Caltrain also coordinates with the BART system to allow for San Francisco and San Jose Airport access. SF Taxicabs

San Francisco has many cab companies with drivers on the streets at given time. As with most cities, the cabs are easier to flag down in the downtown areas during non-peak hours. People whose starting or ending destinations are in outlying neighborhoods may need to call for to arrange cab pick-up. The price is \$3.10 for the first 1/5th mile or flag.
